Dying to Live

Sermon thought: Grace doesn't give us a license to sin, but should motivate us to live holy, righteous lives.

1. Read the first 11 verses of Romans 6. Why is it important to remember who we are as believers when it comes to the matter of sin and grace?
2. Does grace encourage us to sin because where sin abounds grace superabounds? In what way does willfully sinning twists grace to serve our own desires?
3. In verses 3-5, Paul identifies us with Christ. How does or should this identification change the way we live?
4. Tim mentioned three words from Paul's explanation about sin and grace: Know (the mind, v. 8), consider (focus of the heart, v. 11) and present (the will, acting on what you know to be true, v. 12). Why is it necessary to have all three operating in order in for us the live righteously?
5. What is the significance of the following statement from Tim: "I don't live the way I used to live because I am no longer the person I used to be. I have been made new in Jesus Christ."
